Developing, implementing, and monitoring Personal Learning Plans (PLPs) and related support documents. Collaborating with classroom teachers, parents, and other educational professionals to create inclusive learning environments. Conducting regular assessments to track student progress and adjust interventions as needed. Serving as an advocate for students with learning needs, |

Instructional Support and Intervention

- Provide one-on-one or small-group instruction to students as needed, focusing on literacy, math, organization, and social-emotional skills.
- Use a variety of teaching methods and resources to accommodate different learning styles and needs.
- Support classroom teachers by suggesting strategies, modifications, and accommodations to promote student success.

Collaboration and Communication

- Collaborate with teachers, parents, and external professionals to ensure a holistic approach to student support.
- Conduct regular meetings with parents and teachers to discuss student progress, challenges, and strategies.
